

It is an RMS rule that you be financial must а member of a club to hold conditional registration. Our financial year and thus the membership year ends on 30th June, so unless your membership is paid, then your bike is 30th unregistered from June!

RMS Report

Jeremy Conlon from RMS to speak about upcoming changes to Club Registrations

Jeremy has advised that there are no immediate changes to be made to historical or classic registration, however, the new government will be looking at this in the future. The minister in charge will make representations to keep car/bike clubs updated with any changes, prior to any changes being made.

Some clubs in Sydney have been using the registrations as a daily ride, which is where the issues are starting.

Example locally of one member had been caught for not using registrations correctly. This particular person has been jailed for his efforts.

The changes are being more of a digital approach, where log books may be digitalized in the future, but this is not an immediate aspect.

A question was raised that if logbooks are electronic, then the police will be able to monitor. One principle is that the service needs to be open to everyone. There will still be a dual system, ie, phone and the handwritten logbook will still be available.

If changes are brought in, as a Club, we are able to go to our local member of parliament, if no luck there, then we can approach a minister for assistance and a voice.




