




display and the black Commando Roadster was a




later model of the first yellow Norton Commando I owned back in the early 70s.

Minutes of Committee Meeting Held on November 2021

Present: Rob Popplewell, Lara Bechaz, Shane Barns, Kerry Hendy, Eddie Oremek, Trisha Herraman

Agenda: Club Christmas Party

Options were discussed for possible venues for the Club Christmas party this year, with Covid restrictions impacting possible venues and members being able to attend. Options were:

- Hired Premises
- Sawtell RSL
- Private Residence

It was decided that the Sawtell RSL is the best option this year and will be catered by the Club with hot and cold platters. Invitations will be sent out by Lara (thank you) and members will need to respond and pay their contribution of \$10.00 per person to hold their place. Numbers will need to be provided to the Club at least three (3) days prior to the 10^{th of} December.

Membership Applications:

- 1. New member applications From the 1^{st of} January 2022 the committee has agreed that a new member application fee be applied. The new member application will consist of a \$20.00 application fee PLUS the annual membership fee of \$40.00 per member or \$60.00 per family. This will be publicised by Newsletter, announced at Club Meetings, Website and Facebook page.
- New member applications will be provided with an alternative option for initial joining of The Club. New
 members if unable to attend at the Sawtell RSL Club due to personal covid vaccination reasons, will be given the
 option to attend an alternative Club function being the Tuesday, Wednesday or Sunday ride days, within one
 month of their application being received.
- 3. New member applicants applications received from new members MUST be completed in full with the nominator and seconder (financial members) **PRIOR** to being accepted. Applications will be tabled at the next Club Meeting after receipt with the new member either being accepted at the following meeting at which the application is tabled or after attendance at a Club event.
- 4. New Applicants will be provided with the Application Form and a copy of The Club Constitution.
- 5. The Membership Application form will be changed to read that each financial member MUST attend a minimum of three (3) Club events per membership year. This can be Club Meeting, Ride Days, or the Rally Event.
- 6. **Family Membership** Definition amended A Family membership constitutes one riding member and his/her pillion passenger or non-riding family member.
- 7. Each singular riding member will need to pay the minimum membership fee of \$40.00 per year.

Club Membership:

It was discussed and agreed that membership numbers be capped at 300. Once the capacity has been reached, new applicants are then placed on a waiting list for a position to become vacant.

Membership Renewal BBQ:

It was discussed and agreed that The Club would hold an annual free BBQ for members to come along to Bongil (or similar) to have a catch up, chat, sausage sandwich and pay memberships on the third Sunday of June, prior to renewals being due on 1 July of each year.

Club Ride Days:

It was discussed and agreed to create some further interest in members attending rides, a theme day would be arranged for one day each alternative month for a "Best of" award. The "Best" member attending will be provided with a Voucher for \$20.00 to cover their morning tea/lunch. Lara to include in Club Bulletin.

You must record return journeys that are not part of club-organised events and each day of maintenance and personal use in the logbook.

CLUB RALLY Our Club Rally is held Annually in late May.
