Sundays ride scaled the heights up to Sealy lookout for a panoramic view over Coffs Harbour. Then via Bruxner parkway and Bucca road to Nana Glen and on to Glenreagh. Here the Rural Fire Brigade provided lunch & the bikes were on display out front. The return was down the Orara way to Coffs & on to Sawtell in lovely sunshine.

I would like to thank all the committee members for carrying out their various tasks so well. Nick organized the ride routes and the meal stops and museum visits. Jenni did the mail out of rally info and recorded all the entrants details as they came in and took a turn as back-up vehicle driver. Kerry, Mark and Eddie also did back-up duty. A busy few days checking that all was in order, ready and stuck in envelopes and then Friday, 21st May, Day 1 of the rally <u>was all go. There were some 77 registered and prepaid</u>

entries, all ready to go in the envelopes with badges and details, and the registration crew of the Carpenters and Treasurer Eddie slipped into gear and handed them out as the entrants rolled into the Sawtell Caravan Park. There was also the added task of signing up new entries on the day and the rally total grew to a surprisingly high 92 entrants from as far afield as Holbrook and Singleton Club members demonstrating

While those in Sawtell were spilling the yokes down their chins, Glenn White and son, Doug headed up to Dorrigo to meet Life Member Pete Richmond and prepare the Luncheon Hall at Dorrigo Showground for morning tea and set out the category boards for the bike judging. With a quick word of directions, the rally took off from Sawtell and headed up to Dangar Falls for a catch-up stop, then onto the Dorrigo Showground for the morning tea and judging. The judging was conducted by Life Members, Don Sonter, Rob Popplewell and Pete Richmond and it was not an easy task with two very large categories of about 30 bikes each in the '70-80's and '80-90s. There was also a good smattering of very tidy bikes in the older categories. After a fair bit of discussion, the winners were decided and



the rally then split in two. By far the better ride was out via North Dorrigo and Tyringham and returning via Waterfall Way to Bellingen, but many fearing the grey clouds, took the easy option and headed back to Bellingen for lunch via Griffiths' Lookout. In Bellingen, there was a good collection of bikes parked in the old Carl Foster's garage and everyone was able



to find food to their personal taste. Then, under their own reconnaissance, the entrants returned to Sawtell Caravan Park.

On Saturday night at the Sawtell Golf Club about 100 sat down for an enjoyable meal together, and the winners received their prizes and trophies. There was also a tremendous raffle and Gavin Gill had done a splendid job getting around to our very generous sponsors and had


