New Life Members.

After a few brief words from our President Rob Popplewell thanking Kevin and Lance for their ongoing service to the club, our secretary Trish Herreman then presented Kevin Barber and Lance Gilbert their certificate and Medal for Life Membership at the General Meeting held Thursday 17th February.





Kevin Barber recently got some well-deserved recognition. Old Bike Australasia (Issue No. 97) caught up with him and did a write up about his restoration projected on his 1927 side valve 500cc B3 James. Fitting for a member who has just received Life Membership for his 20-some years' service to the club.



OUT IN THE SHED

Restoring a James side-valve twin

I recently had the opportunity to visit Kevin Barber at Boambee near Coffs Harbour. He has almost finished restoring a 1928 side valve 500cc B3 James with a 3 speed James gearbox, 64 x 77.5 mm bore and stroke, a Binks carburettor and sold for 52/10 GBP. Like so many other British makes of motorcycle The James Cycle Company was formally a manufacturer of bicycles, formed in Birmingham in 1897 by Harry James. As was the case with most manufacturers their first motorcycle was a cycle frame fitted with an engine which in 1902 was from Minerva. Production ceased in 1904 before recommencing in 1908 at a new factory built in Gough Road, Birmingham. In 1910/11 their machines were fitted with what was claimed to be the first-ever saddle tank. In 1913 their first two-stroke arrived and ran alongside the side valve and overhead valve models. Some machines were supplied for military use during the First World War, and post war James fitted their own engines. The 500 S.V. model B3 and then the O.H.V, B1 ran from 1928 to 1931. Speedway versions were produced in 1929 and 1930. A road going V twin was enlarged to 749cc to become the largest capacity machine ever built by James. However from 1934 James only ever then produced lightweight two stroke machines to help them survive the depression. After World War II James was taken over by Associated Motor Cycles in 1951 and combined with Francis Barnet in 1957. The last James was produced in 1966.

Kevin originated from Warrell Creek near Macksville. After leaving school he took on an apprenticeship at the local Holden Dealership before moving to Ford at Coffs Harbour. After this he worked at the local council as a mechanic until he retired, hence it can be seen that he has an extensive mechanical background. As a youngster his first machine was a Royal Enfield Flying Flea before progressing to a 1949 500 Rigid Matchless.

This is the second machine of this make and vintage that Kevin had acquired. The first one was a complete but unrestored version. He

refurbished this and later sold it in 1995 to Sydney motorcycle trader Barry Graham who later on-sold it to Barry Hartnell of the Swap Shop fame. He also located and managed to purchase a complete engine that was fitted to a circular saw at Kempsey. He has also acquired a pair of new old stock heads and barrels which had been purchased from the late Patrick "Paddy" Ryan when the business traded from Church St, Parramatta.


In 1996 he acquired another James of the same year and model from David Potts. It was a basket case and as usual over the years when working on this he would find that some small parts were missing. However with his background and a reasonable workshop with lathe and other equipment he was able to make various parts. This included making a rear rack so as to be able to pull the machine back onto the rear stand. Both front and rear stands were made and no doubt the oval shape of the rear stand took some skill to get correct. The small securing clips for those stands are also well made. The guard stays, oil lines and cables all had to be made. Luckily there were two with the brake components, but no rims or spokes. After finding



rims he was able to spoke one himself but had the other undertaken locally. The gearbox was totally unusable but later advised as to where he could purchase one in Queensland. He was also missing two levers which are attached to the base of the cylinders which came together to form the valve lifters when they are activated on the pushrods. Howard Burrows presented them to him when he attended the Bulli Antique Motorcycle Event.

The magneto was restored by Jack Ussher. However one problem that persisted was how to set the ignition. Kevin initially thought that the cam lobe nearest to the pickup was where the spark was delivered. This had him stumped for a while until he was able to use a drill to rotate the magneto and then ascertained that the spark was delivered to a pickup opposite the cam lobe. He worked on the machine in what he terms as dribs and drabs starting from around 2012. The James is now operational and starts very easily, so much so that a gentle push, by hand, on the kick-starter has the engine firing. He still has some finishing touches such as a plate to cover the magneto which is mounted just behind the front wheel. The generator, if fitted, normally sits just above the magneto and is driven by chain from the drive side end of the crankshaft. Kevin tells me that there were three versions of this model. The standard version had no lighting, one optional extra was to have a carbide gas headlight and another was to have the electrics driven by the generator. This machine is fitted with an electric headlight but he had installed batteries behind the reflector to power an LED light. Kevin has undertaken his own paint work and has obviously spent a considerable amount of time on the fuel tank. He initially painted it black and masked off areas for the pin stripping as well as the brand name James in gold. He then applied 6 coats of clear. Some finishing touches and he will have a good reliable early rally machine.



Rob has had discussions with Kevin Barber in relation to his application leading up to the meeting. Rob has indicated he would prefer to abstain from making a decision on the application, as Kevin has indicated he does not believe he will be given fair consideration.

This has left five committee members to vote. The committee discussed the Constitution and how it is interpreted by each member, whereas it states:

3.(v) Life Member: Free membership and is granted to members with a minimum of 20 years service to the Club, or as decided by the committee and are regarded as having the rights of full membership."

The minimum requirement of 20 years service is a member who has contributed as an active member of the Club, taking on positions/service within the Club over and above paying membership dues.

The committee has agreed that Kevin Barber has met the criteria in accordance with the Constitution and will be awarded Life Membership.

After discussions, the Committee also decided that Lance Gilbert also qualifies as a Life Member due to the service he has provided to the Club over many years. This will also be awarded at the next general meeting to be held on Thursday 17th February.

The Committee has acknowledged that due to circumstances, such as Covid, changes in committee members, there has been no review carried out last year as to members who may be eligible for Life Membership. The committee decided to move the AGM back to July when it is traditionally held. The committee will meet in the month prior to the AGM to review the members service and any person qualifying for Life Membership will be informed at the AGM.

Clarification will also be made on the difference of a Life Member and a Free Member.

Well, the bikes and bodies kept rolling in. I didn't do a count, but it was a winner. Great coffee and quick service.











Winifred Wells

"As game as Ned Kelly"

Vivacious 22-year-old Winifred Wells "had two characteristics uncommon amongst her sex". She liked to be alone and she loved to ride motorcycles. The daughter of a furniture manufacturer GF Wells, had been a motorcycle addict for many years, following in the steps of her father. Winfred frequently competed against men, she was a well-known and popular member of the AJS Club.

"While the less intrepid of her sex spent a lazy Christmas and New Year lounging on beaches" in 1950-1951, Winnie Wells set off from her Shenton Park home on her motorbike (around 7,000 miles) across Australia. Solo.

The third of four daughters, her father described Winnie as very determined. "Nothing short of a major breakdown will stop her accomplishing this trip" he said.

It took eight days for Winnie to reach Melbourne. A trip that included the lonely Nullarbor Plain. Due to a disruption of telegraph services on the plain no word was received from her on route. She spoke of travelling for up to 300 miles "without seeing even a rabbit". On the second day she was thrown off her bike in loose gravel near Coolgardie, grazing the side of her face, but this did not seem to worry her.

From Melbourne she rode to Sydney. Carrying her own food, water and first aid kit and spending nights at hotels and boarding houses. On the return trip to Perth she rode through heavy rain east of Norseman and was "soaked to the skin". In total she spent four nights in the bush by the roadside.




As she rode into Forrest Place, Winnie was welcomed home by the Lord Mayor. Wind-burnt and showing signs of exhaustion she laughed and smiled as Mr Totterdell MLA praised her courage. "A performance any man would be proud of" he remarked. "She's as game as Ned Kelly" interjected a man in the crowd. Her mother rushed forward and embraced her, placing a floral wreath around her neck.

In the following year Winnie set off again, this time 10,000 miles around Australia accompanied by her father. Both on Royal Enfield solo machines. The most nerve wracking part the Pardoo Sands between Port Hedland and Broome, where there were 30 to 40 mile stretches of deep sand.



The ride will then leave from Sawtell Caravan Park and go via Sawtell Road, Hogbin Drive, Arthur Street and onto the Pacific Highway heading North. A left turn then takes the route up to Bruxner Park and onto a left turn at Bucca Road and out onto the Orara Way. Heading South, there will be a right hand turn before Coramba that takes the ride up the Eastern Dorrigo Way to Ulong. At Ulong, a subsidised afternoon tea will be provided as "rider's choice" at either the RSL club or the Ulong Cafe.

Dinner: There will be a free "Welcome BBQ" at Sawtell Caravan Park from 6.00pm to 7.00pm for all entrants.

Special Covid Protocols
