

Meeting At Taree on Sunday 27th June 2021

The meeting was held at the Taree RSL and was conducted for some 3-4hrs.

Updates for rules and regulations were presented by Mr Peter Wright (Vehicle registration Liaison) and President Mr Ray Ives

We are generally operating within the rules and regulations of Historic vehicle scheme under the rules of an incorporated club and guidelines of the RMS (services nsw)

Some key points obtained at the meeting

- Official address is not a Po Box. It is the address of the Public Officer.
- Life members have the same rights as fully financial members
- A member is still a member until removed from the register of members held by the Public Officer
- form A6 for the Dept of Fair Trading every time the public officer changes hands. Cost \$53 and 28days to submit
- When roles change, all paperwork is to be given to public officer and then immediately passed onto the next position holder. A bit of double handling involved.
- Re other club's invitations for HVS and CVS, needs to be specified in the minutes the To and From the event. EG: 2 days prior and 2 days after for travelling. Outside minutes documentation, riding is to be logbook inserted.
- If you have a logbook, any and all maintenance runs however small, should be logged in the vehicle logbook.

A major discussion of the event was the Historic Vehicle Scheme (HSV) and the Classic Vehicle Scheme (CVS). I will endeavour to best relay the discussion that followed with club representatives present. Firstly, Peter Wright has a difficult job in liaising with the RMS. This being, every time they start to get progress and understanding with the RMS with regards to the historic scheme, the RMS seem to rotate staff into different sections of the firm, and the CHMC have to start again teaching and bring the new position holders up to speed with a reluctance to make a decision in their new role. A never-ending saga of the relationship. This is apparent when new rules are brought in, and they are done with no insight of the historic clubs of Nsw and the general purpose of these schemes.

The HVS Vs CVS debate. The rules state that a historic vehicle should be as original as possible brought out by the factory. This generated multiple questions. For example, there is conflict between original and safety. It is the CHMC opinion that safety comes first. This was evident when the discussion involved seat belts installed into vehicles that never came out with them. The new position holders of RMS wanted the fitted belt belts to be removed to comply with the guidelines. The CHMC have argued and sort changes to the rule on a safety level. It has been concluded that safety takes preference and vehicle owners can improve safety without jeopardising the rules and historic registration of their vehicle. Examples used were, Wiring, Brake pads and callipers, Suspension, seals belts, lighting which can be enhanced by changing from 6v to 12v. Nonvisual enhancements do not count. One example of contention is that some earlier vehicles came out with red lenses on turning signals, and the RMS wanted them changed to amber. Their requests

are sometimes contradictory in terms, which is an ongoing discussion of educating the RMS.

Now the part which applies to us Motorcyclists.

The CHMC have concluded that their main focus and recommendations should be that clubs do their best to operate with the HVS scheme. That being said, clubs can choose to get authorised inspection stations to do the roadworthiness, or they can select their own inspectors. Based on their discussions with the RMS, there is a grey area with regards to originality and safety improvements. There are always some variations from original, due to a number of reasons such as availability of replacement parts if that is an option. Different wheel and rim sizes, modern tyres are all approved. Fuel tanks from the era are allowed to be changed if it is a factory design. One area I brought forward is that in the motorcycle industry, there were specialised frame makers in the day that gave folks an option to improve their ride by swapping frames over to a different margue. This I was informed that fully complied with the HVS scheme. So, in short, Egli Vincent's, Tritons, Rob North Triples, Seeley frames, Spondon, Rickmans etc are all good to go under HVS category. Choppers, bobbers and easy rider type custom Harleys with using specialised frame makers of the day were fine. This includes engines in Norton featherbed frames style modifications. Where the buck stops, is when frames or chassis are cut and welded from their original design to a stage where it is noticeable and renders the vehicle different to what it was intended. The CHMC also has encountered race cars that were factory built and have been approved for HVS. Obviously, the minimum standard applies for these vehicles such as headlights and taillights. Same goes for race bikes now being converted for the road under HVS. These are the words coming out of Mr Peter Wrights Mouth.

When asked about the CVS setup, this opened a complete can of worms with regards to administration. When I reviewed the RMS documents, the recommendation was to get the vehicle inspected at an Authorised inspection station but was not compulsory. I did have a conversation with Rob Popplewell about this a few years ago, but with litigation concerns, I recommended the club can go down this road for modified bikes as it is a growing area of popularity within older style bikes. Although under protecting the club, I recommended that the first inspection be a blue slip and each following year should be supplied with a pink slip. This took all the risk away from the club's inspectors and committee and put it solely on the inspection station. Under the CHMC, they insisted, and i mean insisted, that all CVS applications go through them each and every year. They want multiple pictures of the vehicle, and inspection station report, then send it to them asap, which only they can approve, and they would send the paperwork back if approved for the vehicle to be registered under the classic scheme. This also included photos ever year of said vehicle, to ascertain whether any modification have occurred from the previous year. If a fairing is involved, then pictures with and without fairing to be submitted. I asked what is the point of all this administration backlog, if a blue or pink slip is supplied as this negates any comeback on the incorporated entities. MR Wright replied with backing from the CHMC president, that this is what their committee have decided as their best cause of action. Also mentioned, is another nsw inc club for historic clubs, that will stamp paperwork much more freely, but they have decided to take this approach within their club and any club affiliated with them. Their recommendation was if the vehicle is not highly modified and can be determined as a product of the era of greater than 30 years of age, except for safety upgrades, clubs within their affiliation, can formalise their own criteria to the limit that their club and inspectors will allow.

In short, with the HVS and CVS guidelines, Both RMS and the CHMC, we the Coffs Restorers club need to sit with the inspectors and the committee to formalise a plan of the best course of action that best suits our constitution and what we want to achieve as a historic club. Where our inspectors are happy to go with regards to approving, when an

authorised inspection station is the best course to take, and where the boundary lies for rejecting applications for roadworthiness.

In short, a meeting needs to happen, with all the inspectors, committee in power, Mr Rob Popplewell and Myself (Peter Tarabay) as we were at the CHMC meeting and can relay things first hand. I hereby would like to call a meeting between the relevant parties and other members who may have strong opinions on the subject, to contact me to arrange a time and place once covid restrictions allow us too.

I have stated above what I recall to the best of my ability, and under no circumstance is this to be taken as 100% accurate and gospel according to CHMC.


