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

But you need to follow that route listed on the ride calendar leaving from your home address and returning in the direction of your home address and make sure your bike has been registered for the day by one of our Captains.

When to fill in your Logbook. You must record return journeys that are not part of cluborganised events and each day of maintenance and personal use in the logbook.


CLUB RALLY Our Club Rally is held Annually in late May.

MEMBERSHIP RENEWAL

The end of the club's financial year is 30th June. Your membership expired on that date. This

means you cannot ride a conditionally registered bike after the 30th June unless you have paid your membership subscription.

As far as the RMS is concerned, if the owner of the vehicle is not financial with his club, then the bike is unregistered, irrespective of when the bike's registration runs out.



OUT & ABOUT

2024 Tassie Tour on a Honda

(1981 250cc single)

The tour started at Ulverstone on Tassie's north coast. It is hosted by the British Motor Cycle Club of Tasmania. I'd been on the 6 previous tours, the first in 2002.

Only a small group from Coffs Harbour this time. Rob Popplewell (Honda), Grahame Maddeford (Ariel), Nick Hiller (Harley- Davidson), and Chris O'Brien (Ducati). But there were a number of others from the north NSW coast that many will know, Neil Parker (BSA), Russell Lockwood (Triumph), Pat Holt (Norton), Ken Hoad, (Indian) and Col McAndrew. (Triumph). Dave Thompson followed the rally in my Hyundai I-van as back-up & luggage carrier.



At the start or the Rall, see if you can spot Rob with hand on his heart wondering if he was going to be able to go the distance. There is Grahame, bottom right doing a runner to Victoria.

<u>Day 1</u> .Ulverstone to Leven canyon and return via Gunns Plains & Heybridge, 132kms.

Morning- Sunny with some cloud and a strong cold wind.

As we set out marshals were in place to get us out of Ulverstone, but from there on, a green & yellow pointing hand on an orange post indicated a change of direction! We were soon in open farming & grazing country and the wind buffeted the Honda about but as we went further, came into forested country and the trees gave some protection.



But branches falling from them was a hazzard. At the canyon I took the half kilometre walk to the lookout. Followed Nick on leaving here, but he gradually got away. Then Grahame's Ariel flashed by,- I didn't even think of trying to keep with him. Back on the coast at Heybridge and it was about here the Honda tacho went doo-lally and I disconnected it. In spite of wind and tacho it was a good day.

<u>Day 2</u> <u>Ulverstone to Mole Creek and return, via Forth, Sheffield, and Moina, 170kms.</u>

Morning- Clear & sunny but cool. Yesterday's gusty wind was now just a breeze. An ideal day for the ride. The views on the route to Sheffield are marvellous. As are the murals in Sheffield itself. This was a morning tea stop. The farming country soon gave way to forested land, winding, climbing & descending. There were lots of dead animals on the road. I suppose this means there's plenty of wildlife here, but not for much longer if this keeps up. Lunch at the Mole Creek hotel, then away again along scenic and great riding roads. Stopped at a lookout for a photo. Was a good spot for bike on the road photos. Particularly wanted one of an Excellcior outfit so waited for it to come by. But it didn't so put camera away and immediately it appeared, but passed before I could get camera out!

<u>Day 3</u> Ulverstone to Strahan via Burnie, Roseberry & Zeehan. 266km.

Morning - Cloudy with a few clear patches, calm and quite cool. As I needed fuel, headed off early and refuelled at Penguin. Decided to ride on & let the group catch me. However, I was so early I was ahead of the bloke putting Orange/Green direction markers in place. I, with Dave in van behind, travelled 20km beyond the turn-off. By the time we got to the morning tea stop, Helyer gorge, the last few riders were leaving. Fortunately, the coffee van was still open and I got my much needed coffee and cake. From here one is in forested hilly country and this continued to Roseberry ,the fuel stop, and

through to Tullah, lunch stop. Dave & I decided to motor on to Zeehan. At the cafe we'd ordered and about to sit when a couple already seated beckoned us to join them. They were French tourists and having seen the old bikes along the road wanted to know about them. Their English wasn't too bad, but I found myself drawing on my school French at times, however I suspect my French was more amusing than informative to them. None the less it was a pleasant encounter. At Strahan Dave & I shared a cabin with Russell & Neil. Dave's bed was so uncomfortable, he took mattress into lounge room & slept on floor there! Day 4 -A lay day in Strahan. Though there was an optional 234km loop ride to Reece dam.

Morning – Part cloudy and cool. I preferred to have the lay day. There was a Bar B.Q. this evening on waterfront. If you liked barbequed fresh salmon there was any amount, for one of the Tour organizers owns a salmon farm on Macquarie Harbour. It was swimming around only hours earlier. I preferred snags & cheese crackers.



Day 5 Strahan to Hobart via Queenstown & Lyell highway. 300Kms.

Morning - Sunny and clear but quite cool. The longest ride of the Tour. It had rained overnight so the very winding road out of Strahan was wet. Tell-tale oil/fuel colour patches, many on apex of bends, kept all to a cautious pace. More coffee and cake in Queenstown before heading for Hobart. Although cold, the sun was out, and I had good gear on so enjoyed this ride. A bike pulled out some distance ahead and as I closed on it detected the wiff of petroil, a two stroke. He accelerated to a good speed, so I gave him plenty of air but decided to keep him in sight.

We came to a steep winding ascent and he went up well. Then we caught a caravan, but twoey wasn't going to let this hold him up and executed a very risky overtake. I wasn't so

brave, (or foolhardy), and trailed the caravan till I could safely pass. At Derwent Bridge I discovered the twoey was a Scott. After lunch I visited a sculpture known as "The Wall". Could describe it loosely as a portrayal of Tasmanian history in wood. I saw it first on my 2013 Tassie Tour while it was still a work in progress. Worth a look if you're passing through. From Derwent Bridge it's an undulating descent to the Derwent valley. An ice cream stop at Ouse, then on to Hobart. Surprised how dry the countryside was here, hills a dry straw colour. This area was always lush green on my prior visits.

Day 6 -Hobart An out and back loop ride to Tahune airwalk. 210Kms.

Morning - Sunny & mostly clear, still cool.


I decided to have another lay day & do some sight-seeing in Hobart. Had lunch in *The Cat and Fiddle* arcade and watched the cow jump over the moon. Worth a look if you've not seen it.

After lunch we drove to Mt Wellington.

Day 7 Hobart- Another loop ride to south, only 116kms.

Morning - Sunny with some cloud but not too cold.

Rather than ride, I decided to drive to find a good spot to photograph bikes as they headed towards the lunch location. Dave & I then joined them at lunch. This was held at the property of one of the Tour organizers. It had a great view of the Derwent, but viewing his workshop and collection of restored bikes was marvellous. 30 or more and all going. He loaned 2 to Tour entrants whose bikes failed, so they could complete the ride. Nearly all from the major English manufacturers. One that intrigued me was a 3-cylinder Brough Superior. One cylinder vertical, the other two out each side, raked slightly downward. An experimental model that didn't make production, so it's probably the only one in existence. The Brough car he has is also pretty rare.

Day 8 Hobart to Port Arthur- 121kms.

Cloudy grey, but not raining. Almost mild!

First stage took us to historic Richmond via the Risdon Vale Road. I recall in 2002 it wasn't used because it was considered too dangerous. That year we were going into Hobart from Richmond. However, a few of us used it as our map indicated it was sealed and a lot shorter to our accommodation. A delightful road now though.

Had a wander through the Richmond fair before heading to Port Arthur. A spatter of rain caused a pause at Sorell to put wet weather gear on. Rain petered out soon after. Missed a direction marker and thereby was on a short cut to our motel. Dave didn't miss it so arrived 20 minutes after me.

Many stayed at Port Arthur motel which backs onto the historic gaol site. It's quite expensive to go in there, unless you discover the unlocked gate from the motel into the site! Neil Parker did but didn't tell us until it was too dark. And a bit more about darkness,- a power outage on the peninsular had us all well and truly in the dark for a few hours. Our meal at the motel dining area was limited to 2 options as kitchen facilities were out. Power didn't return till around 9pm.

Day 9 -Port Arthur to Bicheno – 222kms. Morning - Cloudy overcast with light rain. Planned to detour from the first part of the Tour route via a more interesting road. Rain thwarted the plan, for it is mostly unsealed and has steep sections. Many riders stopped at Sorell for morning tea, but I rode on hoping to find a small roadside cafe,- but there aren't any!

I reached Orford before I found a cafe. Spotted Grahame's Ariel. He & Glennys were there and Nick & Jenni came later. Rain had cleared now. Road follows coast and I had a pleasant ride to Swansea. Thought Dave was behind me and waited here, but when he didn't show decided to ride on. Found I had no ignition! Checked connections & fuses and all seemed O.K. Pushed Honda to nearby garage to get battery checked. Nick was there & suggested I check fuses again. I did and they *looked* fine but looks deceive. I had spare fuses & made a change. Ignition again. A relieved ride to Bicheno, our night stop.



Day 10 - Bicheno to Launceston via St Helens & Scottsdale. 236kms

Morning- Sunny through scattered cloud, calm, mild.

Today's lunch stop was the Weldborough pub, but Dave & I had decided on the Pyengana Cheese factory cafe. About 3km off tour route but has a much better lunch menu. I was checking tyre pressures as the riders departed after briefing when Dave came along in van. I thought he'd see me and stop, but no, he followed the pack. Won't see him till Pyengana, so much for back-up! Road north follows coast and is quite scenic. At Chain-of-Lagoons there's the option of

Elephant pass or coastal route, but as the Elephant pass *pancake emporium* was closed, continued along the coast. The wind had picked up but was a tail wind. Refuelled at St. Helens. Saw Russell and Neil's bikes but no sign of them, or Dave. The route now swung inland & becomes winding and hilly and stays so until nearing Launceston. Dave was waiting at Pyengana turn-off. The cheese factory cafe is well worth visiting if you're out this way,- and *The Pub In the Paddock* is just down the road. The orange hand on green post worked well in country areas but we'd been told to refer to our ride direction sheets for route

to accommodation in Launceston. But with going home from work traffic, over passes, under passes and multi exit round-a -bouts thing got a bit chaotic! One exit led to an industrial car park, I know because I ended in there, and I wasn't the only one. But we did get to our motel which turned out to be quite posh!

Day 11 Launceston -A loop ride through the western tiers 220kms

Morning- Sunny through scattered cloud, calm, mild.

A great day for the ride, but I was feeling a bit jaded so decided to join Dave in the Van and follow the ride route. Through farming /grazing country initially, with the Western Tier highlands ahead. They were wreathed in cloud & mist, and it looked cold. We caught a couple of riders on what seemed to be 30's models at the base of the climb. They didn't hold us up though and I was impressed how they went up this steep and winding ascent. Road along the top was recently sealed and had nice sweepy bends. I'm sure the riders loved it. It was now clear of cloud & not particularly cold. Lunch at Miena. An area was set aside in hotel for riders who had pre-paid their meal. I went in and was almost shirt fronted by an organizer who assumed I was an interloper after a free meal as I wasn't in riding gear. He backed off when I produced my meal ticket. Programmed the GPS to get us back to accommodation!

Day 12. Launceston to Devonport via Deloraine & La Trobe. 121kms

Morning- Cloudy but otherwise fine, breezy, cool.

This morning a couple of marshals shepherded us out of Launceston. Then we were back to hand on post directions. This was the last ride day and there was no specific morning tea or lunch stop.

The route was along more traffic roads today, but we had a nice rural motor cycle friendly diversion prior to Deloraine. On the edge of the village of Elizabeth Town there's a cafe that has a large sign proclaiming, "Motor Cycle Parking". Ned was very impressed when we discovered it on a previous Tour. I told Dave I'd meet him there for lunch. It was on the Tour route. No other bikes there when I arrived. Parked Honda and awaited Dave at roadside. As he approached, I realised he wasn't slowing, so stepped out and waved and yelled but he drove on & disappeared up the road.

Couldn't raise him on mobile so went in for a feed and kept trying. Eventually got through

and directed him back. Much of the last part of the ride was on motorway, then had to thread my way through Devonport to motel. This was the end of Tour ride. Just to-nights Tour dinner and it would be over. Dinner was at a club within walking distance from motel. Most convenient as we learned all beer, wine & soft drink was free! Spirit drinkers had to pay. This was the first time the Tour group dinner was at Devonport rather than Ulverstone. One would be hard put to find a better place than in rural Tasmania to ride an old motor cycle. That's why I've done 7 Tours and hope to make it 8.

It was a punctual start for the Friday ride from "Rally Central" at Grafton Showground out to Minnie Waters on Friday, 23rd August. Drinks were gulped and catch up conversations truncated as the riders fired up the 50 -60 bikes for the run out along the Big River Way to Ulmarra and on to Tucabia and Minnie Waters. It had been a scenic run along the mighty Clarence River and then a run out across rural land and forests to the beach side setting at Minnie Waters. The Clarence Valley Club had a few eskies and nibblies on hand as the entrants resumed their conversations but now with views of the surf. The large contingent from the Triples Rally were still pumped and regaled the first day ralliers with the tales of their successful rally on the previous weekend. It was then a ride back through the Pillar Valley to the old highway and back into Grafton. That evening, there was the welcome BBQ with Clarence Valley President, Jeff assisted by Margaret who did the duty serving the sausage and pattie burgers to the assembled throng. 
