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

CLUB RIDES See the ride Calendar in the Magazine for upcoming rides, Rally's & Events. LOGBOOK You must always carry your Logbook and Membership Card when riding/driving your club bike/car.

Your logbook does not need to be filled out when you are going on a club calendar ride. But you need to follow that route listed on the ride calendar leaving from your home address and returning in the direction of your home address and make sure your bike has been registered for the day by one of our Captains.

When to fill in your Logbook. You must record return journeys that are not part of cluborganised events and each day of maintenance and personal use in the logbook.

CLUB RALLY Our Club Rally is held Annually in late May.

Membership renewal.

The end of the club's financial year is 30th June. Your membership expired on that date. This means you cannot ride a conditionally registered bike after the 30th June unless you have paid your membership subscription.

As far as the RMS is concerned, if the owner of the vehicle is not financial with his club,



then the bike is unregistered, irrespective of when the bike's registration runs out

MEMBERS SECTION

Members are required to attend at least three events during a membership year and can be by way of attending a Club meeting, ride days, the rally, Club Christmas party or Membership BBQ Day.

Members are required to abide by the Club's Constitution, refer to the Club website.

The Club will hold an annual BBQ at a venue for members to attend from 9.00am to 3.00pm on the third Sunday in June. This is a casual get together to have a chat, pay your membership for the following year prior to the due date of 1 July.

Natureland Classic Motorcycle Club Rally 1st - 3rd November.

Wow, Natureland has got the old mumbo jumbo back!! It was a real case of back to the future. The experiment at South West Rocks is forgotten and it is back to Hat Head. We stayed at the old Creek Street house used for years by Coffs Restorers, (but lost to motorcyclist for many years, when a bloke from Bonville rented it and had all his mates down and filled the yard with motorbikes, trailers, tents and campervans and took out the fly screens and ran power leads into the house), the "Hat Head Hilton" was back in business, and the Bowling Club was serving cold beer to all and sundry.

Many folks made a full week of the rally, and a good contingent from Newcastle stayed the week, while the Hunter Valley Norton Owners turned up in force with their own trailer and organised some of their own rides during the proceeding week. Lots of others, including ourselves, moved in on the Thursday in preparation for the Rally and began the swimming, fishing, walking and partying that so befits the venue. Besides the 30-40 entrants from Newcastle and the Hunter, there were entrants from Lockyer Valley, Yass, Port Macquarie, the Central Coast, the Gold Coast, Inverell and many other locations. All this set the scene for the rally and everything was already humming along when the official Natureland rally started on the Friday, with a gentle warm-up ride along Kinchela Creek, the Belmore River and through Austral Eden. The Norton Owners had left with about 50 riders earlier in the

day at about 10.00am, but there was still a good crowd on the official warm-up run at 1.00pm. The ride took us back to the Gladstone pub before we headed back to Hat Head, dropped our bikes at Creek Street and wandered down to the Bowling Club for some light refreshments and complete our registrations. It was then time to return to our abode for a few more beers and wines and ex-treasurer Eddie's excellent spag bowl!

Next morning, after a quick swim, it was time to head down to the caravan park to prepare for the Saturday ride. All morning, Hat Head had been alive with the sound of bikes arriving and warming up, and it soon was apparent why. The car park to the Bowling Club and the entrance to the caravan park were just a mass of bikes. It was an outstanding static display, with rare models, pristine restorations, some modifieds and bikes from just about every manufacturer.

After the official welcome and instructions, the marshals left and within 10 minutes it felt like we were part of a start race, with everyone pulling on helmets and gloves and beginning the ride. There was well over a hundred bikes and it was quite a sight to see them on the road. Lines of bikes ahead, and another line in the rear vision mirrors. The route was back to Gladstone, then Summer Island Road and around to the Macleay Valley Way, Eungai, Upper Warrell Creek to the first catchup at the Caltex in Macksville. It was then via Wilson Road to Bowraville and out to Missabotti for a morning tea that couldn't be beat! The bikes were judged at Missabotti while we enjoyed the hospitality, then it was back on the road and back via Rodeo Drive to Macksville and South to Hat Head.

The lunch and presentation was done in the reserve at the Hat Head Caravan Park and the Natureland crew did an amazing job of feeding the hungry crowd and no-one went wanting for quality or quantity. Most of the crowd retired to the Bowling Club later though many smaller events happened at the campsites and accommodation.

Sunday saw a small ride out to Crescent Head, but we took the easy option and turned North at Gladstone for Coffs Harbour.

A great rally that left everyone in a good mood and vowing to attend next year.



Hi there fellow motorcyclists.

You are receiving this information because either:

- a. You have been a previous entrant on the Tassie Tour Motorcycle Rally
- b. You have expressed an interest in joining the Tassie Tour Motorcycle Rally or
- c. You are a member of the British or Vintage motorcycle clubs of Tasmania.

So given the above I am sure you will be pleased to hear that the Tassie Tour Motorcycle Rally for pre 1970 motorcycles is on again in 2026. (Woo Hoo.)

The rally will run in March 2026 for 10 or 11 fun filled days of riding and comradery on some of the best riding roads in the world.

Due to overwhelming demand entries this year will be via an expression of interest so please be aware that submitting an expression of interest does not automatically mean you have secured a place on the tour. As always, we will endeavor to accommodate as many people as possible however we are limited by the logistics of accommodation and meals etc to a maximum of 120 riders.

As in past years expressions of interest will be online only, via our

website <u>www.tassietour.info</u> and will open on **Saturday January 11th 2025 at 12 noon**. (Click on the "Expression of Interest" tab on the website to enter)

Entry will be on a first come basis and expressions of interest will close once we reach our entry limit. (If you miss out you can message us to be added to our wait list in case there are cancellations)

Therefore, if you are interested make sure you get your entry in early (The last Tassie Tour was filled in 41 minutes after opening – you have been warned).

If you are lucky enough to secure a spot, we will email you with details of how to pay etc within one week of the entries closing.

More information is available on our website linked above but a couple of important points to note are:

- This event is strictly only open to motorcycles built prior to the 31^{st of} December 1969
- We will give preference to those who are intending to complete the entire rally (You will be asked this when you submit your expression of interest)
- You will need to pay the full entry fee of \$325 within 7 days of being accepted on the event or your position will be forfeited The first \$100 is non-refundable if you withdraw later.

For those of you who want to read some more about the event there will be an article published in the January edition of AMCN (Australian Motor Cycle News) written by Alan Cathcart who was our guest speaker on the last tour. This is expected to be out in newsagents around the 8th of January and I'm sure will be a great read.
